General objective

This course will provide the student with a theoretical and practical frame that will allow him or her to elaborate valid "critiques" of Architecture. The course will provide various examples of Latin American Architecture and Urbanism and its Critique so that the student may understand the way Architecture and its Critique has developed throughout the 20th century and the beginnings of the 21st.

Specific objectives

The course will specifically focus on the problems that have arisen in the sphere of Architecture and Urbanism in the last century and a half, with a particular emphasis on how these problems were originated/received and answered in Latin America.

By the end of the course, the student will:

Understand that an epistemological framework is necessary to be able to judge architectural objects.

Develop a framework that is adequate for the critical judgement of Latin American architecture

Learn how to derive critical judgements on contemporary socio-political problems by using said framework.
